I had a perfect life. It was a ball of gas in liquid that could not be pierced by unhappiness. No one died, and no one was sick. We were all happy and loved life.

Then I found out my grandfather had cancer. No matter how much I told myself he would live, somehow I still felt as if it was a death sentence. He was so young, only 63. He fought so hard. Whenever I feel my own life taking a turn for the worse, as if things would never get better, I remember how many years he lived fighting such a scary and difficult disease.

After he died, a grand gathering was held for him. All his friends and relatives attended it. It was a traditional Irish wake (守灵). They ate and drank and celebrated Grandpa's life. He died with dignity, surrounded by loved ones.

I honestly don't know how I managed. I never cried alone. I had the compassion of my friends and the support of my family and teachers. I just remembered my grandfather's wish that we should celebrate his life after he passed away.

That's how we came up with the idea for Hives for Lives — a business my wife and I started where all the profits go to the American Cancer Society. We sell honey, honeycombs, beeswax candles, and lip balms, which all come from our beehives in Virginia.
